- **Q4** NATO is essential for the long-term security of the United States.
 - 42.1% Strongly agree

- Q5 America has the resources to oppose both Russian military aggression in Europe and Chinese military aggression in Asia.

 - 8.8% Unsure

- Q6 When it comes to the war between Russia and Ukraine, which comes closest to your view?
 - 22.0% The United States should not be involved at all.
 - The United States should offer some military assistance to Ukraine while also pushing for an immediate ceasefire, even if it means Russia gains some Ukrainian territory.
 - 28.2% The United States should increase its military assistance to Ukraine, no strings attached.
